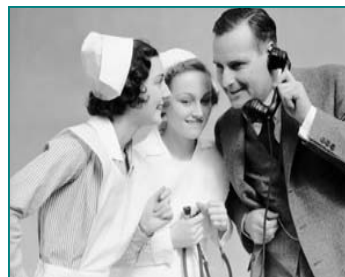

Wes Matthias has worked in the field of geriatrics and developmental disabilities for the last 18 years. He is one of the few pharmacists to be certified in both geriatric pharmacy and psychiatric pharmacy. Wes has presented to multiple groups in the past, but prefers to present to DD nurses as their passion exceeds that of other groups. He also serves on the Board of Directors of multiple DDNA state groups

Dr. Diane Krasner Ph.D, RN **"Wound Care for People with I/DD"**

Diane Krasner is a board-certified wound specialist with extensive experience in wound, ostomy and incontinence care. She is co-author of the consensus paper "Implications of the CMS Inpatient Hospital Care Present on Admission Indicators/Hospital-Acquired Conditions Policy. A researcher who focuses on wound pain, palliative wound care and legal issues related to wound care, she has numerous publications in wound care literature and lectures nationally and internationally on wound and skin care.

Dr. Jill Morrow **"Gastrointestinal Problems in Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities: Usual and Unusual"**

Dr. Morrow is currently the medical director for the Office of Developmental Programs for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. She graduated from medical school from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and completed Pediatric specialty training at Tufts, New England Medical Center in Boston. Dr. Morrow also ran the Child Development Center, a multidisciplinary diagnostic center for children with developmental disabilities, at Polyclinic Hospital in Harrisburg, PA.

Dr. Keller is a Developmental Neurologist with many years of experience in treating adults with I/DD. He provides consultative services for both community and state facilities.
